School Improvement Plan

School Visits – 1st, 4th and 6th still to come

Writing PD – Day 1 of the training was very productive, day 2 will be at the beginning of the 18/19 school year

Cluster Groups – students, teachers and parents are all feeling good about the work and pace of learning that is being accomplished. With the continued success of these groups we will hit the ground running at the beginning of the 18/19 school year with the continuation.

18/19 Changes in schedule and Proposed Changes in the Arts and Humanities Schedule –

Mr. Ashley reminded everyone about the change in schedule approved by the high school SBDM in January, this change will take grades 7-12 to a 7 period day as well as the change in the grading system which will be going to a 10 point scale.

In order for our 6th grader to have the opportunity to transition into a more “Middle School” environment they will be moving to a 7 period day as well.

In order to achieve the optimal schedule for our students in k-4th grades a 5 segment Arts and Humanities schedule is proposed, this would include the following:

- Music (excluding 6th grade)
- Art
- PE
- STEM
- Library

Students in 5th and 6th grades attend Arts and Humanities on a quarterly schedule.

Mrs. McGuire suggested we consider a weekly rotation instead of a daily rotation, the council agreed they would take into consideration over the next few months.

Student Achievement Report/Data

STAR – winter window January 8-12th had great results.

Fall to winter seeing substantial growth, would like to see the more significant growth in 6th grade. Researching other options for the high 6th graders.

Math numbers are improving showing us the programs being utilized are being impactful.

KPREP Planning – There are lots of changes this year to KPREP, KDE develops a plan and submits to the Federal Government for approval, this year the Federal Government did agree with KDE so they sent it back for revisions.

The three significant areas for elementary are:

- Proficiency (reading and math)

- Growth (table)
 - Catching Up
 - Keeping Up
 - Moving Up

Staying Proficient now does not give you oints but does not loose points either

- Accountability – 3 areas schools are rated
 - Comprehensive
 - Support
 - Improvement
- Separate Indicators (writing, math, social studies)
- Gap – still reporting but using dial representation with a scale of “very low” to “very high”
- Other Factors – (attendance, behavior, opportunity/access, transition readiness (ex. Are 5th graders prepared for MS transition)
- No language mechanics
- Science only in 4th grade
- 5th grade – writing and social studies

Budget

Rachel fait – looking at numbers will meet with committee, she will send a survey to staff asking for them to reply with the most effective and frequently used programs.

Budget Reduction - Based on information from state we know there will be a reduction in SEEK funds, we just don't know how much. The state has to submit budget to school by March 30th.
